We are pleased to announce that Melanie Knap has accepted the position of Colebrook Town Treasurer. Melanie and her husband, Michael, have been Colebrook residents for 24 years. Melanie has a degree in Accounting from Southern Connecticut State University— and has worked as an accountant, bookkeeper and controller during the course of her career. There is also a small increase for our Dial-a-Ride program. The complete pricing schedule will be posted at the Center.

Also, at this week's Board of Selectmen's meeting, an advisory committee was formed to explore the opportunity for composting food waste in Town. Alesia Maltz has agreed to serve as Chair.
