To renew by mail, please include a check and a self-addressed, stamped, return envelope.

Town Emergency Management Director Rick Tillotson, Deputy Director (and Colebrook Fire Chief) Sean Barry, Registrars of Voters Sherri Gray and Karen Odell, Town Clerk Debi McKeon, and I are preparing for a statewide emergency management exercise next week. Sponsored by the Connecticut Division of Emergency Management and the Secretary of State, the exercise is intended to help local municipalities prepare for emergencies that could occur during the upcoming election season, and other unforeseen emergencies.

Last Sunday, the Colebrook Land Conservancy hosted a guided walk on our Town's newest trail. Led by well-known naturalist and educator Jay Kaplan, 22 species of birds were identified during the course of the walk. Located on the Colebrook Land Conservancy's Sandy Brook Forest Preserve in North Colebrook, the <u>Sandy Brook Trail</u> is a 1.5-mile long loop trail bordered by two brooks. Trail guides are available at the trailhead, which is on Beech Hill Road on the left just beyond the bridge that connects Sandy Brook and Beech Hill Roads. Park in the grassy area off the road.

A Colebrook tradition continued this week when the third-grade at Colebrook Consolidated School held its classes at the historic <u>Rock School</u>. Established in 1779 and used until 1911, the Rock School is one of <u>11 one-room schoolhouses that once served Colebrook</u>. Nine are still standing.

Last night, the Colebrook Lions Club honored three Colebrook graduating high school seniors as scholarship recipients. Congratulations to Sandra Carfiro, Ayla Fritz, and Mattea Young.

The Town Pond (at the end of Cooper Lane in Colebrook Center) will be open for swimming beginning on Friday, June 14th. Weather permitting, lifeguards will be on duty Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays (from 10 a.m.to 6 p.m.) and Sundays (noon to 6 p.m). The season will run through Sunday, August 25th. When lifeguards are not on duty, the gate will be closed and swimming is at your own risk.
